Nominations



- Early-career, mid-career, and senior level awards from national and international institutions, societies and academies:
 - MIT Tech Review 35 Innovators Under 35
 - Popular Science Brilliant 10
 - Popular Mechanics Breakthrough Award
 - Lemelson-MIT Prize
 - Anita Borg Early Career Award
 - National Academy of Inventors
 - AAAAS, ACM, AIChE, IEEE, AIMBE, ASME Fellow
- Up to 100 nominations per year with a 30% average success rate.



Award Tracking and Publication



- Faculty self-report awards they receive on myViterbi using the Honor/Award Notification Tool. Department Chairs screen and release the information as appropriate and the Dean's Office, PR and the Office of Awards are notified.
- Types of awards that should be reported: All and any external awards, including best papers. A selection of awards and all best paper are posted on the Awards website.


Honor Notification Tool

Why are awards important?

Awards recognize the excellent work of our faculty. They also serve to elevate the profile of USC and the Viterbi School nationally. We nominate individuals across all career stages, disciplines and categories. In fact, 40% of 2017-18 nominees were junior faculty, strategically laying the groundwork for their career trajectories.

Types of award nominations we process:

- » International/national awards and prizes (i.e., Guggenheim Fellowship, Kavli Prize)
- » National academies (i.e., NMTI, NAI, AAAS)
- » Society awards (i.e., fellows, medals, and technical awards)
- » Early career honors (i.e., TR35, NAE Frontiers of Engineering)

How the Awards Office supports faculty:

- » Matches awards to faculty
- » Confirms nominees meet eligibility requirements
- » Reaches out to nominators and references
- » Drafts letters, as needed
- » Tracks and manages all final nomination elements for submission

What we ask from the faculty:

- » Names of nominator(s) and reference(s)
- » Current CV
- » Nomination/research statement draft
- » Required nomination elements (i.e., patents, publications, citations)
- » Reporting of successful nominations via the Honors Notification Tool (on myViterbi)
